- 1 - Piece of Fabric with Adhesive Back 4 ft. x 5 ft.
- 1 - 36" Adhesive Strip

- 1 - Piece of Fabric with Adhesive Back 8 ft. x 5 ft.
- 1 - 36" Adhesive Strip
- 1 - Instruction Sheet

### MOUNTING THE FABRIC:

**Note:** The adhesive backed fabric may be mounted directly to your wall, but the wall surface may be damaged if the fabric is removed. We suggest mounting the fabric to a piece of material such as thin plywood, and securing that to the wall.

- Peel back the paper backing from one edge of the fabric.
- Line up the fabric on the wall or mounting material and press the exposed edge of the adhesive to the mounting surface. **DO NOT** remove all of the paper backing at once as the fabric could fold and the adhesive will stick tightly to itself.
- Smooth out the fabric and peel off more paper as you press the fabric onto the surface, being careful not to get any wrinkles in the fabric.

### MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST:

All of the following wear points should be checked on a monthly basis and recorded on the checklist enclosed.

- Check that the edges of the fabric do not loosen from the mounting surface. If edge comes loose, repair with a rubber or contact glue.

### THINGS TO DO WITH YOUR STICKY WALL:

#### THINGS YOU CAN MAKE:

1. Cut various shapes out of:
  - Meat packaging Foam
  - Craft Foam Sheets
  - Cereal boxes
  - Felt Sheets
  - Plastic lids from old butter bowls or coffee cans
  - Paper milk cartons or paper plates
2. Use pictures that represent daily activities to create a communication board. Activities could include things like dressing, eating, brushing teeth and reading. There could also be pictures of places that represent activities, like the bathroom, playground, or classroom. Also, you could cut out pictures of Southpaw Equipment from the catalog and laminate them, allowing the child to choose the activity he/she would like to do.
3. Tic-Tac-Toe board on Wall  
Make the Tic-Tac-Toe board with hook fastener tape or felt strips, and make game pieces by placing strips of hook fastener on different color ping pong balls, or by making lightweight bean bags with hook fastener on them.

## THINGS YOU CAN BUY:

1. Flash Cards: animals, colors, shapes, letters, math.
2. Collector Cards: baseball, football, hockey.
3. Stickers: cut shapes out of foam sheets, cereal boxes, etc. and put their favorite stickers on them.
4. Thin wood shapes, available at many craft stores.
5. Stencils / Punch-out sets: you can buy a punch out set at many educational supply stores. There are letters, numbers, shapes, etc. You can use stencils to draw the outlines for any of the above things, then cut them out.
6. Make-up wedges: these typically come in an interesting variety of shapes and colors.

## CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS:

- Check for client allergies first.

- Wipe with a damp cloth.

## STORAGE INSTRUCTIONS:

- Store where not accessible by clients without proper supervision.
